4	Atswhatimtalknbout	David Flores	Ron Ellis	12-1	Talented horse had poor previous start; Ellis thinks he'll rally with best race.
5	Peace Rules	Edgar Prado	Bobby Frankel	8-1	Speed horse could struggle with distance. Won five of previous six.
6	Funny Cide	Jose Santos	Barclay Tagg	15-1	A strong second in the Wood. Geldings are 0-for-the-Derby since 1929.
7	Offlee Wild	Robby Albarado	T.V. Smith	30-1	Missed two months because of illness. Improving, running on home track.
8	Buddy Gil	Gary Stevens	Jeff Mullins	8-1	Won three in a row. Concern: seemed to tire in previous race.
9	Indian Express	Tyler Baze	Bob Baffert	12-1	Unproven with just four starts. Closed strong in runner-up Santa Anita run.
10	Lone Star Sky	Shane Sellers	Tom Amoss	50-1	Looooong shot. Biggest win came here in a Grade III last July.
11	Domestic Dispute	Alex Solis	Paddy Gallagher	30-1	Would Baffert have sold this horse if he could win the Derby? No.
12	Empire Maker	Jerry Bailey	Bobby Frankel	6-5	Best-bred horse; hottest trainer and jockey. Only concern: foot.
13	Eye of the Tiger	Eibar Coa	Jerry Hollendorfer	50-1	Lightly raced colt was second in the Lexington. Too unproven.
14	Ten Cents a Shine	Calvin Borel	D. Wayne Lukas	50-1	Don't waste your \$2. Lost previous three races by combined 80 lengths.
15	Outta Here	Kent Desormeaux	Bill Currin	50-1	Just one start at 3, fourth in Dubai. Also too unproven.
16	Ten Most Wanted	Pat Day	Wally Dollase	6-1	Huge horse improved rapidly to become hot pick. Day's back is achy.
17	Scrimshaw	Cornelio Velasquez	D. Wayne Lukas	15-1	Seemingly sharper after breathing problem corrected. Lukas is high on him.
