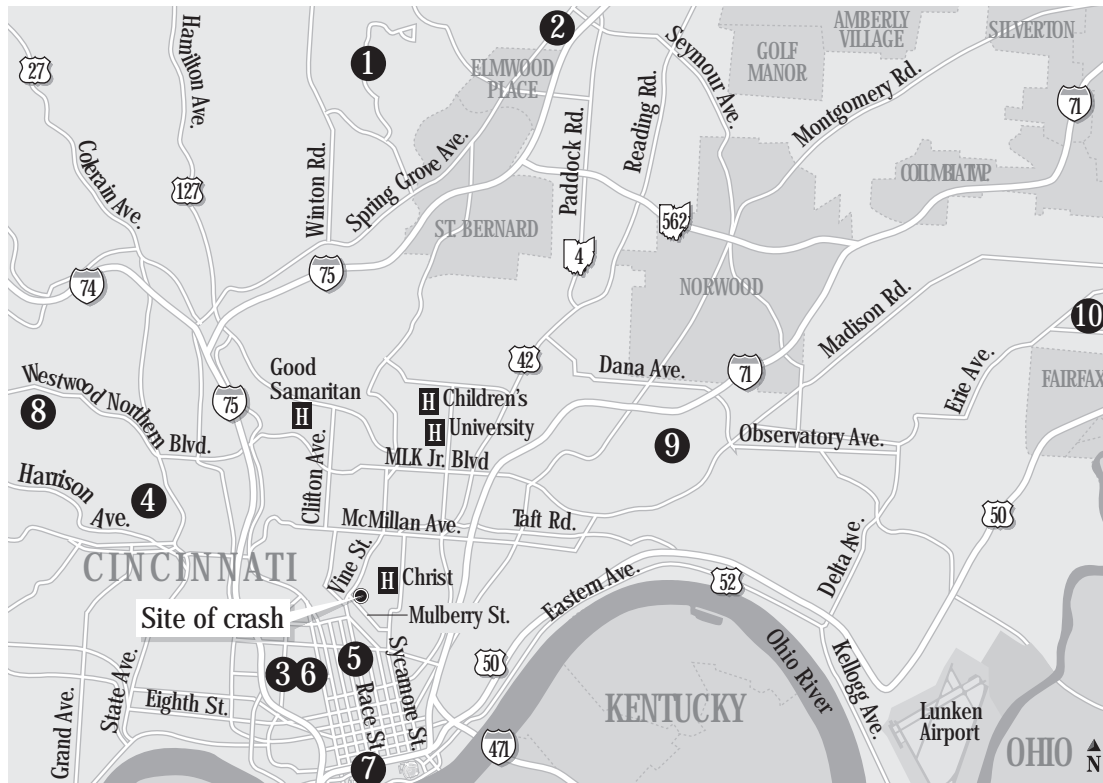


Ambulances crisscross all over city

When 22 people were hurt in a tour bus crash June 6, Cincinnati fire officials got help from Golf Manor and Woodlawn ambulances because most of Cincinnati's ambulances were on other calls. Here's where the other Cincinnati units were, according to dispatch reports, and what those emergency medical technicians and paramedics were doing when and after the bus crashed in Mount Auburn a little after 3 p.m.:



BASIC AMBULANCES

AMBULANCE 9, HOUSED IN BOND HILL:

- ① 2:39 p.m.: Winneste Avenue, Winton Place, 18-year-old woman with abdominal pain, to Good Samaritan Hospital.
- ② 3:21 p.m.: West 69th St., Carthage, 18-year-old woman complaining of dizziness and vomiting, to University Hospital.

AMBULANCE 17, LOWER PRICE HILL:

- ③ 3:13 p.m.: Ezzard Charles Drive, West End, unconscious woman, to University.

AMBULANCE 29, WEST END:

- ④ 3:01 p.m.: Baltimore Avenue, South Fairmount, 85-year-old woman with chest pain, to Good Samaritan.
- ⑤ 3:32 p.m.: Race Street, Over-the-Rhine, 45-year-old with droopy face and movement problems, who refused to be taken anywhere.

PARAMEDIC RESCUE SQUADS

RESCUE 14, DOWNTOWN:

- ⑥ 3:05 p.m.: Ezzard Charles Drive, West End, unconscious woman, to University.
- ⑦ 3:10 p.m.: Pete Rose Way, downtown, patient taken by another unit to Good Samaritan Hospital
- ⑧ 3:30 p.m.: Saffer Street, Westwood, 48-year-old diabetic man with trouble breathing, to University.

RESCUE 46, HYDE PARK:

- ⑨ 3:06 p.m.: Wabash Avenue, Evanston, 70-year-old woman with a cardiac history who was having chest pain, to Good Samaritan.
- ⑩ 3:49 p.m.: Luceme Avenue, Madisonville, 47-year-old woman with chest pain and numbness in her hand. Unclear where she was taken.
